

Elected Officials & Constitutional Officers

Board of Chosen Freeholders - 732-431-7387

The five-member board, which gets its powers from the state Legislature, is elected to staggered three-year terms and sets policy and budget for county government operations.

County Clerk - 732-431-7324

Issues real property records, maintains the Open Public Records Search system, oversees the passport office and federal, state, county and local elections.

County Surrogate - 732-431-7330

Probates wills, qualifies administrators of estates files and applications for guardianship and adoptions.

Prosecutor's Office - 732-431-7160

Oversees criminal investigations and prosecutions and educates the public about the criminal justice system, crime prevention and victims' rights.

Sheriff's Office - 732-431-7139

Manages the 9-1-1 communications center, the county corrections facility, law enforcement division and emergency management.

Monmouth County provides programs and services as either the primary provider or by working cooperatively with local, state and federal agencies.

Consumer Affairs - 732-431-7900

Helps resolve consumer disputes (billing, contracts, home repair and non-fulfillment of services).

Courts - 732-677-4300

Adjudicates criminal, civil and family court matters and provides jury services.

Economic & Workforce Development - 732-431-7470

Strengthens job and workforce development opportunities while promoting the county as a tourism destination.

Education - Brookdale - 732-224-2345

Vocational - 732-431-7942

Provides Brookdale Community College and a vocational school district for high school students and adults.

Human Services - 732-431-6000

Provides aging, disabilities and veterans' services, mental health and addiction resources, legal, housing, food, energy, medical, protective and transportation services.

Library System - 732-431-7220

Manages the largest circulating library collection in the state and provides resources, programs and events.

Mosquito Extermination Commission - 732-542-3630

Uses an integrated pest management approach to control mosquitoes and provides tick-testing services.

Park System - 732-842-4000

Manages more than 15,000 acres of parks, recreation and open spaces and provides programs and events.

Planning - 732-431-7460

Coordinates planning efforts to meet the long-term development, environmental, transportation and other objectives of the county growth management guide.

Safeguards the health of residents by providing clinical and preventive services, education and environmental programs and restaurant inspections.
