Welcome to Seven Presidents Oceanfront Park

President Grant named Long Branch the nation's "summer capital" in 1869. The tradition of summer visits continued with Presidents Hayes, Garfield, Arthur, Harrison, McKinley, and Wilson...leading to the park's name.

This 38-acre beach park also features a year-round Skateplex (weather-permitting) for skateboarders and in-line skaters and Tony's Place, a playground for people of all abilities.



Activities by Season

Summer. Everything for a day at the beach is available: a snack bar, showers and changing area, sand volleyball courts, guarded swimming, designated areas for surfing, fishing and launching watercraft.



Year-round. Fishing and boating continues in the off-season, as do programs at the Activity Center and use of the Skateplex and playground.

Winter. This beach offers prime winter birding opportunities, and when the pond freezes, a place for ice-skating too.

Activity Center

A Protected Ecological Habitat

The dunes act as a barrier against severe storms and serve as a natural habitat for threatened shorebirds and plants. The Park System regularly reinforces the dunes by planting erosion-fighting beach grass. Certain areas of the beach are removed from raking to "let natural processes prevail."



Two endangered birds-the Least Tern and Piping Plover, and a species of special concern-the American Oystercatcher, now breed successfully at this site. This, in part, is due to protective efforts such as roping off parts of the beach to alert visitors that there may be delicate nests and offspring inside.



Park Hours

Seven Presidents Oceanfront Park is open every day of the year from 7 a.m. (8 a.m. in the summer when fees are charged) to dusk.

Avoiding Tick Bites

Ticks that may cause illness can be active year round (highest risk April-July). Take precautions: use insect repellent; wear light-color clothes, long-sleeve shirt tucked into pants/pants tucked into socks; check yourself for ticks during and after park visits; shower soon after being outdoors. To minimize contact keep to formal trails, walk in the center; stay away from tall grasses, brushy/shrubby areas, leaf litter, branches and woodland edges next to lawns, athletic fields and along trails. The park offers a seaside-themed, universal access playground where people of all abilities can slide, jump, climb and explore under the sun near the pavilion.




Beaches

There is 1 mile of clean, sandy beach to enjoy. Certified lifeguards are on duty from 10 a.m.-5 p.m., Saturdays and Sundays starting Memorial Day weekend, and daily from mid-June through Labor Day weekend. An office and first aid station are located in the Pavilion (seasonally), where people with disabilities may arrange for use of a surf chair.



A parking fee and admission fee are charged 8 a.m. – 4 p.m. from Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day weekend. Parking and admission are free during the rest of the year. Seasonal admission and parking passes go on sale the Saturday before Memorial Day weekend.



A larger, plaza-style skate area (1), 2015) features a bowl plus ramps, ledges, stairs, railings and a "wave" (bump to quarter pipe). The smaller area (2), 2020) has transition elements like two quarter pipes, a waterfall "twinkie," spine ramp and volcano. A court with outdoor fitness equipment offers year-round workout options.

The Skateplex & Fitness Court are open year-round, from 8 a.m. until the posted park closing time.

Use is subject to weather/safety conditions.

NOTE:

- -Visitors under age 17 must wear an ANSI or SNELL approved helmet at all times while in the skate park.
- -Elbow/knee pads and wrist bands are recommended.

Fishing/Small Boat Access

The National Saltwater Angler Registry Program requires saltwater anglers age 16 and up to register (for free) to fish in marine and fresh tidal waters of NJ. Visit www.saltwaterregistry.nj.gov. Special trailer parking to launch car-top and small personal watercraft is located behind the Activity Center.
