

# BAYSHORE WATERFRONT PARK - BEACH REPLENISHMENT PROJECT



Following serious storm damage, this beach is being replenished by the US Army Corp of Engineers with sand taken from the bottom of the Atlantic Ocean, off the coast of Sea Bright, NJ. This project is funded by the federal government as part of the Superstorm Sandy federal-aid package approved by Congress last year.

**The goal of this project is to:**

- Restore ½ mile of beach to a width of approx. 95 feet
- Rebuild protective dunes behind the restored beach
- Extend the fishing pier another 195 feet
- Install a 300 foot rock groin to prevent new sand from moving/drifted



Beach replenishment work began in June 2014. The fishing pier is expected to close around July 5th for the replenishment and construction. The rock groin portion of this project will shut down the fishing pier and adjacent beach area for another 7 months, possibly longer depending on weather, mechanical issues, and/or unforeseen circumstances.
