## Environmental Education Programs for Groups

### Group Leader Information

**PAYMENT:** Groups will be billed after the program has been completed. Please **do not bring payment on the day of the program** or send any payment before the program has taken place.

**PICNIC FACILITIES:** Outdoor tables are available at most park locations on a first come, first served basis. We ask that the area be left as clean or even cleaner than it was found. Unless otherwise noted, there are no indoor facilities available.

**TRANSPORTATION:** Buses must park in designated bus parking areas, when available, and should remain with the group the entire day. Depending on your program location, there may not be a safe shelter available if the weather turns inclement and your transportation must be available in case an early departure is required.

**LATE FOR A PROGRAM:** Please call the Huber Woods Environmental Center at 732-872-2670 so that your program leader can be informed of your estimated arrival time. Every effort will be made to accommodate your group. However, your program will be shortened and possibly forfeited.

#### **PROGRAM CONFIRMATION:**

- Your organization will be contacted the week before your scheduled date to confirm your program.
- The group leader will also be directly contacted by a Monmouth County Park System staff member a day or two prior to the program. During this important phone conversation, the group leader will be asked to review program specifics and discuss contingency plans in the case of inclement weather.

**CANCELLATIONS:** Please call our environmental education program information line at 732-872-7369 as soon as you know that you cannot attend your scheduled program date and we will try to arrange a new date for you.

#### **DRESS:**

- Participants must wear suitable clothing for the weather. Please ensure all participants come prepared for general temperature fluctuations and light rain.
- Sturdy closed toed shoes are required for all programs to ensure the participant's safety.
- If desired, participants should apply sunscreen and insect repellent prior to arriving at the park.

## **SUPERVISION:**

- There is no fee for a limited number of supervising adults to attend our educational programs. Supervising adults are required to assist with programs. You must provide at least one supervising adult for every 25 participants, with a maximum of one (1) supervising adult per every eight (8) program participants. Special accommodations can be made for teacher's aides, school nurses, or other necessary staff by calling our environmental education program information line at 732-872-7369 in advance of your program date. Additional fees may apply for additional adults attending the program without prior approval.
- Please provide the following information to all supervising adults regarding their role on the trip:
  - Monmouth County Park System Staff are not present to discipline program participants. It is the group leader's responsibility to ensure discipline.
  - Program participants must be directly supervised at all times.
  - Supervising adults are present to assist and coach students, and must refrain from completing tasks assigned directly to program participants.
  - Cell phone use is prohibited.
  - Smoking is not permitted in program or picnic areas.
  - Use of video cameras is not permitted during program.
  - For safety and limiting disruption of program, please take only candid photographs of children participating in program, unless otherwise instructed by program staff.

**SPECIAL ACCOMMODATIONS:** The Monmouth County Park System does not discriminate on the basis of disability in the admission or access to, or treatment in, its programs or activities. We offer inclusive services, which provide another choice for individuals with special needs or disabilities who desire the opportunity to participate alongside peers with and without disabilities in an integrated setting. ## Environmental Education Programs for Groups

### Group Leader Information: Fossil Day

Grades: 3-adult  
Length: 2 ½ hours  
Offered: May-September  
Minimum Group Size: 12  
Park: Shark River  
2010 - 2011 Program Fee: \$9.20 per student  
Groups from Monmouth County: \$7.35 per student  
NJCCCS: 2.6, 3.4, 5.2, 5.5, 5.8, 5.10, 6.1, 9.2

Participants become paleontologists for the day as they learn about the creatures which lived in Monmouth County more than 35 million years ago when it lay beneath a shallow sea. Students learn how fossils are formed and view some of the amazing fossils that they may discover during their fossil expedition. Students construct their own sieves which they take home with any fossils they find.

- This program will be conducted entirely outdoors. All students and supervising adults should dress in layers appropriate to the weather and be prepared for light rain.
- Students should bring a clear plastic zip-lock bag suitable for collecting their found fossils.
- Your organization will need to provide at least two supervising adults per class that are willing to enter the water to assist with shoveling in the stream (students will not be doing any of the shoveling). We have a limited number of shovels available, but adults may prefer to bring their own.
- Students and designated supervising adults will enter the water in their own clothing and their own closed toed shoes. We suggest wearing old sneakers. Clothing and footwear will get muddy and wet, please instruct participants to dress accordingly.
- A change of clothing and footwear is required for after the program. Participants may also wish to bring a towel.
- We suggest that supervising adults bring needle nose pliers to assist with holding nails.
- Participants and supervising adults should bring drinking water.
- Please allow for additional time after the program has been completed if your group plans to use our outdoor tables to have a snack or lunch at the park.
- This program can be adapted to suit the recreational nature of summer groups. Please call our environmental education program information line at 732-872-7369 for details.

Garden State Parkway to exit 100 for State Highway 33 east. Continue on State Highway 33 to Schoolhouse Road, turn right. Park entrance will be on right.

State Highway 35 to State Highway 33 west. Turn left onto Schoolhouse Road. Park entrance will be on right.
