OVERVIEW

- CCIS is an acute inpatient hospitalization for 5 – 17 year olds located at Monmouth Medical Center in Long Branch, New Jersey.
- All inpatient hospitalizations are accessed through the local Psychiatric Emergency Services (PESS).

GOAL

 The unit's primary focus is, within a short period of time, the stabilization of behaviors that warranted hospitalization, returning the child/adolescent to their home and community.

OBJECTIVE

 To work with the family/guardian and identified supports within the community in order to remobilize the child/adolescent through the development of new and appropriate coping skills.

Treatment Milieu

- Daily therapeutic activities primarily occur in a group setting.
- Psycho educational, adjunctive therapy, recreation, community goal setting and individual/family meetings occur daily.
- Education is also provided once the child/adolescents school district approves tutoring from our certified special education teachers.
- The Regional Response Coordinator acts as a resource to the child/adolescent, family/guardian and community partners during the course of hospitalization and afterward as requested.
