

Wall man charged in Colfax Pharmacy burglary

WALL – A Monmouth County Crime Stoppers tip led police to charge a township resident Friday in connection with the 2013 burglary of the Colfax Pharmacy.

Alan S. Velinsky, 31, of Wall, was charged with burglary, criminal mischief and possession of burglary tools, according to Police Chief Robert L. Brice.

At the time of his arrest, Velinsky was in possession of a hypodermic needle. He was charged with possession of drug paraphernalia, police said.

Additionally, Velinsky was charged with theft from the 7-Eleven on Route 35. While employed at 7-Eleven during the last week of June, Velinsky stole more than \$500 in cash, said Detective Sgt. Joseph Wilbert.

Velinsky burglarized Colfax Pharmacy, 2501 Belmar Boulevard, on Nov. 17, 2013, police said.

Velinsky shattered the front glass door, entered the building and then left without taking any proceeds. Police responded after the alarm activation at approximately 2:30 a.m., but he left prior to their arrival, police said.
