LEGISLATIVE REPORT 3- 9 - 2013

A-2593 Requires designated fire command structure in municipal emergency operations
S-1397 plans involving mutual aid responses to fires
Has passed both houses and sent to the governor.

A-2596 Would remove the requirement that one and two family residential structures be
S-1829 equipped with fire extinguishers. Conditional veto sent to Commissioner DCA,
must perform a study and report back to the Governor within six months.

A-2399 Requires all State Fire Fighter training be accredited.
S-900 Passed both houses sent to the Governor.

A-2291 Requires Medical Oxygen providers notify the Fire Departments when deliveries
are halted. Passed both houses sent to the Governor.

A-1570 requires all new one and two family residential units have sprinkler systems.
S-2273 had been conditionally vetoed by the Governor. Amendments as per the
conditions have been made. Bill has passed the assembly 44-30

A-1551 makes numerous changes to the Public Meeting Act.

S-1452 All three bills combined into one bill, Make multiple changes to the Open Public
S-465 Records Act.
S-546

A-2600 The bills reduce the 60% requirement for exempt status to 50%.
S- 2673

A-2911- These two bills permit consolidation of all fire districts in a municipality
S-1956-

S-2 Senate President Sweeny,s bill on consolidation and shared services. This bill and the
numerous bills to move the election are the bills that would have the greatest impact on
Fire Districts.

AJR-15 A joint resolution encouraging the municipalities to move all elections to
November

A-145, A1334, and S-1774 Move Fire District elections to November

A-148 and S-1299 move Fire District elections to the day of the primary elections

S-1423- Moves election to April with Type 2 School Board elections

A-824 Moves election to date of non partisan election

Note; It is now permissible to purchase new fire trucks without bidding.
