

**Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the
MONMOUTH COUNTY
STORMWATER TECHNICAL ADVISORY

1. CALL TO ORDER:

Mr. Casagrande called the meeting to order at 9:36 a.m.

2. COMPLIANCE STATEMENT: Open Public Meetings Act

Mr. Casagrande offered a statement that the meeting was being held in compliance with P.L. 1975, c.231, the Open Public Meetings Act. He further noted that supplemental notice of remote participation in the meeting via Webex internet conference and telephonic conference was given in accordance with the guidelines established by the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs.

4. Regular Reports:

A. Staff/Pre-Adoption Review Subcommittee- Ms. Mallm stated that the two ordinances under review for discussion at today’s meeting are from the Township of Marlboro, and the Borough of Shrewsbury. Ms. Mallm reported the STAC still has not reviewed Englishtown Stormwater Control ordinance. Ms. Mallm noted that there were no updates on the Pre-Adoption Review Subcommittee, and no updates on legislation. The next scheduled meeting date is September 1, 2021.

5. REVIEW OF MINUTES

The minutes of the July 7, 2021 meeting were reviewed. Mr. Eareckson moved to adopt the minutes and Ms. Morrissey seconded the motion. Minutes were approved by voice vote.

6. OLD BUSINESS - None

7. NEW BUSINESS

1. Township of Marlboro - Ms. Mallm stated that this ordinance was reviewed at a December Pre-Adoption Review Subcommittee meeting, upon further staff review it was noted that the ordinance set mitigation requirements but it did not include green infrastructure. The Township of Marlboro worked directly with NJDEP to draft language that was more consistent with the Stormwater Management Rules. Ms. Mallm stated that the ordinance is now consistent. Ms. Morrissey made a motion to recommend to the Monmouth County Planning Board to approve the Township of Marlboro Stormwater Control Ordinance. Mr. Barris seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.
2. Borough of Shrewsbury – At the June STAC meeting, Ms. Mallm stated that based on her conversation with NJDEP, there are issues with how the applicability section aligns with the Residential Site Improvement Standards. Ms. Mallm reported that she met with Shrewsbury Borough’s engineer, Dave Cranmer, and NJDEP to revise that section. Ms. Mallm stated that the Shrewsbury Borough ordinance sets a requirement that residential development disturbing 5,000 square feet or more shall be subject to quantity control standards. Under the Residential Site Improvement Standards, only quantity control standards may apply to residential disturbance under 1 acre. As the ordinance now reflects that, Ms. Mallm stated the ordinance is now consistent with the Stormwater Management Rules. Ms. Morrissey made a motion to recommend to the Monmouth County Planning Board to approve the Borough of Shrewsbury Stormwater Control Ordinance. Mr. Barris seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.
