- Projects, plans and programs must be located in Monmouth County and must have been completed or fully implemented between September 1, 2020 and September 30, 2021
- Nominations may be subject to an onsite inspection if deemed necessary by the Planning Merit Award Committee

Award recipients will be notified prior to the award presentations at the Monmouth County Planning Board December 2021 meeting.

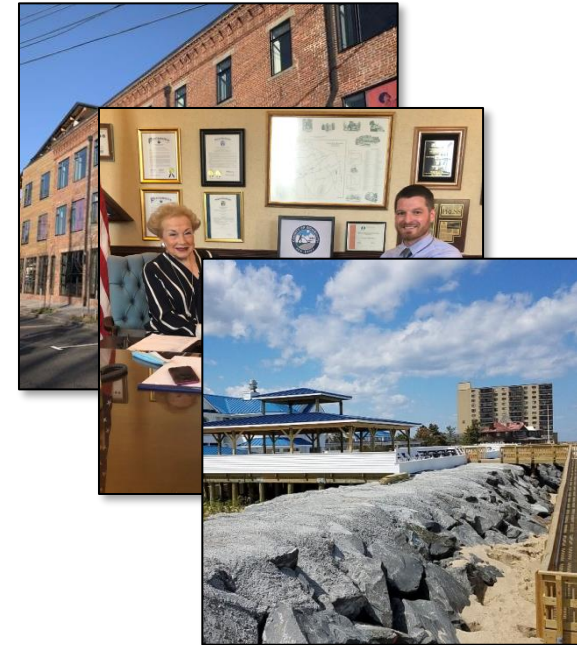
