WITHIN THE NJ DEPARTMENT OF CHILDREN AND FAMILIES

The NJ Children's System of Care (CSOC) provides emotional, developmental and behavioral health care services.

A 24/7 Toll-free access line - (Spanish & English) is provided by PerformCare, the CSOC Contracted System Administrator (CSA). This service is free.

PerformCare (CSA): 1 877 652 7624

PerformCare will schedule an in-home assessment or make referrals as noted below:

- **Mobile Response and Stabilization Services (MRSS)**
Short-term intense services that come to guardian / child within one hour of request.
- **Care Management Organization (CMO)**
Longer term care management, connection to full range of treatment / support services, and a Child and Family Team that creates individual service plans.

Referrals to MRSS & CMO must be made through PerformCare 1 877 652 7624

- **Family Support Organization (FSO)**
Family staffed to provide family-to-family peer support, education, and advocacy. Parent support groups in Spanish & English and Youth Partnership Program for ages 13 - 20.

Abuse and Neglect

Common Signs of Child Abuse and Neglect

Physical:

Bruises, welts, burns, lacerations, abrasions, fractures

Sexual:

Complaints regarding genital areas, sexually transmitted diseases, unusual knowledge about or preoccupation with sex (seduction), pregnancy, alcohol/drug abuse, excessive delinquency

Neglect:

Consistent hunger, poor hygiene, inappropriate dress, lack of supervision, unattended physical problems or medical needs, excessive absences

Emotional:

Aggressive or withdrawn behavior (inhibition of play), unusual fears or compulsive behaviors, running away, sudden change in mood or behavior, anti-social behavior

INTERVENTION

Under NJ law, any person having reasonable cause to believe that a child has been abused or neglected in any environment (e.g., home, institution) shall immediately report to the **Division of Child Protection and Permanency (DCP&P)**. (N.J.S.A. 9:6-8.10)

Stigma

Stigma is an attribute, behavior, or reputation which is socially discrediting in a particular way; it is a form of discrimination that causes an individual with mental illness to be classified by others in an undesirable, rejected stereotype rather than in an accepted, normal one.

Mental health stigma is fueled by the misconception of what mental illness looks like. Too often, the public perception of mental illness is—in actuality—a perception of mental illness untreated. Understanding that mental illness can be treated just like any other illness is the key to wellness and recovery.

NJ Governor's Council on Mental Health Stigma Respect. Understanding. Change. Everyone is touched by mental illness at some point in their lives. The Council's mission is to raise awareness of mental health and address stigma as a top priority in New Jersey's effort to create a better mental health system. Mental illness *can* be treated.
