A 24/7 Toll-free access line (Spanish & English) is provided by PerformCare, the CSOC Contracted System Administrator (CSA). This service is free.

PerformCare (CSA): 1 877 652 7624 PerformCare will schedule an in-home assessment or make referrals as noted below:

- Mobile Response and Stabilization Services (MRSS) Short-term intense services that come to guardian/child within one hour of request.
- Care Management Organization (CMO) Longer term care management, connection to full range of treatment / support services, and a Child and Family Team that creates individual service plans.

Common Signs of Child Abuse and Neglect

• Physical:

Bruises, welts, burns, lacerations, abrasions, fractures

• Sexual:

Complaints regarding genital areas, sexually transmitted diseases, unusual knowledge about or preoccupation with sex (seduction), pregnancy, alcohol/drug use, excessive delinquency

• Neglect:

Consistent hunger, poor hygiene, inappropriate dress, lack of supervision, unattended physical problems or medical needs, excessive absences

• Emotional:

Aggressive or withdrawn behavior (inhibition of play), unusual fears or compulsive behaviors, running away, sudden change in mood or behavior, anti-social behavior

INTERVENTION

Under NJ law, any person having reasonable cause to believe that a child has been abused or neglected in any environment (e.g., home, institution) shall immediately report to the **Division of Child Protection and Permanency (DCP&P).**

(N.J.S.A. 9:6-8.10)
