

**Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the  
MONMOUTH COUNTY SOLID WASTE ADVISORY COUNCIL**

**Thursday, September 17,2015 7PM**

**Monmouth County Reclamation Center, Tinton Falls**

**I. Meeting Opening –Attendance**

The meeting was opened at 7:00 PM by Chairman Johnson. It was announced the meeting was being held in compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act, P.L. 1975, Chapter 231.

Boodey requested a notation in the minutes that Mazza will operate and run the facility.

On a motion by Boodey seconded by Throckmorton and approved unanimously, the minutes for the July 30, 2015 meeting was approved.

**II. Correspondence, Reports and Announcements**

**SWAC Members Report**

Rainforth commented that educating multi-family is so important. Matawan has many multi-family housing and it is challenging to get the recycling message out to the residents.

Metzger reported that ReCommunity( formerly JFD) has discontinued paper shredding on Saturday mornings. This service will be missed by the residents.

Metzger said the Recycling Directory has been completed. It is anticipated the new version will be available for distribution by the New Year.

Metzger stated the intern is available for presentations to schools (Public & Private) at no charge. This is a short term internship so we hope schools take advantage of the opportunity.

Newman talked about the new proposed transfer station – Resource Engineering, LLC, Howell Township. Both the town and the County have received their application. The request and application for inclusion into the Monmouth County Solid Waste Plan for a proposed solid waste transfer station,

located at 34 Randolph Rd. Block 5, Lot 4, Howell, NJ. The transfer station will include a 25,000 sq. ft. main building, an 8,000 sq. ft. maintenance garage and office building and a scale house. The facility will receive type 13 bulky waste and type 13C construction and demolition debris. Hours of operation will be Mon – Fri. 7 am – 5pm and Sat. 7 am – 12 (noon). The site will have a septic system, and well water and the facility will be served by an on-site wastewater treatment system. SWAC members will be taking a site visit of the location soon. Johnson said it is a good idea to keep the township in the loop.

Newman reported the food waste initiative with Brookdale College doesn't seem to be developing; there has been no further communication with staff. Boodey suggested trying to contact the Environmental group within the college.

Newman said the Recycling Stimulus Initiative (RSI) checks were issued to the towns that made some strides in improving their recycling rates. The Recycling Office is waiting to receive their spending plans for the award.

Newman told the Council the computer/electronics legislation is still pending waiting for a vote from the Senate Environmental Committee. If they pass the legislation it will go the Assembly and then the Governor's desk. He said he received a call from Panasonic regarding future plans.

Newman reported he heard from more towns on their temporary debris management areas. He also visited County yards. Newman said the NJDEP is nit picking with the TDMA submissions.

There being no further business before the council, and no one else wishing to speak, it was duly moved by Boodey, seconded by Lomangino and unanimously approved to adjourn the meeting at 8:30 pm.
