

**Minutes of the Regular Meeting of the  
Monmouth County Solid Waste Advisory Council  
Thursday July 18, 2019  
Monmouth County Reclamation Center  
6000 Asbury Avenue Tinton Falls, NJ**

**I. Meeting Opening – Attendance**

The Meeting was opened at 7 pm by Chairman Lomangino. It was announced that the meeting was being held in compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act, P.L. 1975, Chapter 231.

**II. Old Business**

Approval of the minutes from the March 14, 2019 meeting was moved by Boodey, seconded by Posten, and unanimously passed.

**III. Regular Business**

Sims Provided the Recycling Coordinator's Report. Sims reported that he finished out the school year with the recycling visits. Sims advised that over 6,000 students were seen this year in the different schools districts throughout Monmouth County. Sims also reported that he and Fran Metzger, Recycling Coordinator, have both been conducting recycling talks with different Civic Group, Enviro Clubs, and Municipalities to discuss current recycling

conditions and better ways to recycle. Sims also stated that he and Metzger are now going to summer recreation camps for recycling presentations to the campers. Finally, Sims mentioned that a summit is in the works for late October for recycling coordinators and code enforcement officials. The purpose of this summit is for local code officials to have an understanding of what the enforcement inspectors from the health department look for on inspections and to eliminate the issues with recycling in the municipalities. The location of the summit will be at the Monmouth County Fire Academy.

Sims and Newman reported on the Recycling RFP. The county and Atlantic Coast Fibers are still having discussions. There was nothing new to report.

Newman reported on the Solid Waste and Recycling Master Plan. Newman stated that the county is awaiting the draft report.

Newman reported on AA, Administrative Action, for Republic Service. Newman advised that this is procedural process for the NJDEP, New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, to have a formal truck routed designated and spelled out.

Newman reported that the county has received a draft report on the Traffic study regarding Resource Engineering Project, Howell Twp. There was no action needed at this time.

#### **IV. Public Comments**

Joan Osborne, 28 Bronia Street, Howell Township; Her comments were regarding the Solid Waste and Recycling Master Plan and also the resources from the county's inmate labor program.

Bill Kessler, 71 Edgebrook Court, Tinton Falls; His comments were regarding the Solid Waste and Recycling Master Plan and wondered if it would be online to review once completed.

D.J. Mazza, Mazza Recycling, 3230 Shafto Road, Tinton Falls; Mr. Mazza reported that they have installed a new single stream processing line for recyclables. They have also installed an optical sorter, possibly the first of its kind here in Monmouth County. Their machine has just started production.

Frank McIntyre, Greenway Recycling, 89 Yellowbrook Road, Farmingdale NJ; Mr. McIntyre inquired if there was any time frame with the Solid Waste and Recycling Master Plan. He also went on record and **“stated that their Proposed Project of their Class B Recycling Facility should be permitted, regardless of the outcome of the Solid Waste and Recycling Master Plan, without waiting for the final outcome”**.

SWAC member Throckmorton inquired about how many pending applications are on record with the Advisory Council.

A motion was made by Boodey and seconded by Branch to close the Public Comments.

There being no further business there was a motion by Posten seconded by Strauss for adjournment at 7:31pm
